Caring Makes a Difference



Children from birth to 18 years of age are accepted into our foster homes based on the individual needs of the child. A thorough needs assessment helps appropriately match the children to the specialties of each foster family.

Children are placed in foster care when the family problems have significantly impaired the natural parent's ability to effectively train their own children. The children are removed from their homes as a means to insure the safety and well-being of that family. Reasons for placement in foster care may include emotional, physical or sexual abuse; behavioral and emotional problems; abandonment; substance abuse by the parents; or the death of a parent.

Caring Makes a Difference

Foster Care is the providing of a caring, stable, substitute family environment for children until they can return to their own families, move to a permanent adoptive home, or live independently on their own. At Remi Vista, we believe that Foster Care Families provide the love, guidance, and discipline they would give their own children, while working with the Remi Vista social worker to address the foster child's special needs.

Remi Vista is . . .

a private, non-profit corporation, dedicated to the protection and restoration of children. As part of our ministry, we provide foster homes for children and adolescents whose families are in crisis. Foster care at Remi Vista is viewed as a ministry where caring families share their home and lives with the foster children.

Remi Vista foster parents are stable, caring, couples and individuals who have the desire and skill to minister to the needs of children from dysfunctional families. They have the patience, understanding, and energy needed to form a relationship with the foster child.



Remi Vista selects . . .

foster parents very carefully. We are looking for people who appreciate the importance of holistic approach to all activities and relationships. Foster parents are special people who:

- graciously open their hearts and homes to become a temporary family to an apprehensive, fearful child.
- encourage hope and instill purpose in the life of a child.
- are prepared to deal constructively with a wide range of behaviors.
- desire to understand a child's situation and existing problems.
- recognize they are "teaching parents" with a goal to reunite the child with his parents or the goal of preparing the child for emancipation.

Remi Vista provides . . .

highly trained professional social workers to work with foster parents, providing the best environment possible for a child to reach their maximum potential. This therapeutic team, composed of foster parents and a Remi Vista social worker, develops goals and objectives with each child to help give them direction and purpose in their lives. All Remi Vista foster parents have the opportunity to become part of a growing Remi Vista family dedicated to providing quality, caring homes for children. All foster parents receive training, supervision and financial support for providing a foster child with supervision, room and board, clothing, recreation, medical and dental, psychological, psychiatric, and incidental services.

Continuing Education

Foster parents are not only provided with the initial training, but each Remi Vista region offers monthly continuing education meetings. Pertinent topics, special speakers, and media presentations keep foster parent informed about the current issues in working with children in this specialized situation.

Professional Support Services

A Remi Vista social worker regularly visits each of the foster homes to provide support and encouragement, as well as teaching and training the foster parents appropriate techniques for dealing with the unique behaviors of the children. Our social work staff also meet regularly with children to offer counseling services.
